## POLLING STATION AND LOCATION REVIEW

### NOTICE OF REVIEW OF POLLING DISTRICTS AND POLLING PLACES 2019

#### The Review of Polling Districts and Polling Places (Parliamentary Elections) Regulations 2006

The above regulations require each local authority to carry out a review of Polling Districts and Polling Places on a five yearly basis. The reason for this review is to ensure that all electors within the Borough of Swindon have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable and to ensure that polling stations are accessible to all electors, including those with special needs.

The consultation period will commence on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> July 2019.

The Acting Returning Officer for the Parliamentary Constituencies of Swindon North and Swindon South will be consulted and will make formal comments on the existing polling places and stations and any newly recommended polling places and stations. These comments will be published within 30 days of receipt.

Representations and comments on the proposals are invited from all residents, elected members (MP's, Borough and Parish councillors) and persons or organisations that have a particular expertise in relation to access to premises for people with different forms of disability. Any representations given should, if possible, give alternative places that may be used as polling places.

### OUTSIDE LIGHTS

One of the things that makes the Parish so unique and wonderful is the lack of street lighting to blight the villages. Sadly more and more people are now erecting high wattage outside lights and leaving them on permanently. Please consider your neighbours who may not wish their rooms lit throughout the night especially bedrooms where sleep can be seriously disturbed.

Emma Marrington, CPRE's Rural Policy Campaigner said:

Discrete and considerate outside lighting that only comes on when needed is the best type to mount if lighting is considered necessary. Everyone is becoming more aware how energy wastage is resulting in the earth's resources being diminished. Every light that is on when no one needs to use the light it casts is adding to this wastage. So please look at your lighting needs and think of your neighbours as well as the planet and only light when needed.

# Essential road upgrades will start in October to enable 8,000-home development to go ahead

Major highway improvements designed to facilitate the construction of new housing communities will begin in earnest over the next few months.

The schemes are part of a £72m programme of road improvement works which will be taking place over the course of the next few years to ensure vital infrastructure is in place before new houses are built east of the A419.

The New Eastern Villages (NEV) project is one of the largest greenfield developments in the country. It will consist of around 8,000 homes, new schools, employment spaces and community facilities. It will span 724 hectares, with its eastern boundary reaching the point at which the River Cole meets the A420.

In order for the development to go ahead, the Council has prioritised the need to ensure the roads and junctions around the A419 can cope with the anticipated increase in traffic that the NEV will bring, and a Cabinet meeting will be held on 10 July at which approval will be sought to allow the schemes to proceed.

The first improvement scheme is proposed to take place at the White Hart junction this October. This key project will involve the construction of a new northbound on-slip road from the roundabout onto the A419, replacing the existing unconventional and below-standard slip road. The southbound slip road from the A419 onto the roundabout will be widened, the roundabout will be signalised, the existing entry onto Ermin Street will be closed and replaced by a new priority junction on Oxford Road and the number of lanes circling the roundabout will be increased.

These changes will create extra capacity on the roundabout that will help to reduce queuing traffic which backs onto the A419 at peak times.

Some additional land will need to be acquired to enable the new northbound on-slip to be constructed and negotiations with landowners are currently ongoing.

Another key project involves making major changes to the Gablecross junction, the work for which is proposed to start in January 2020. In its current form, the junction is not big enough to accommodate the expected increase in traffic levels. Plans are in place to make the junction larger and to add traffic lights. Modelling tests have shown that this will provide sufficient capacity to accommodate more vehicles. If approval is given, the work at Gablecross should be completed in March 2021.

In January 2020, work will also begin on the Southern Connector Road, a new road which will link the NEV with Commonhead roundabout. The two-way single carriageway road will be about 1.5 miles long and measures will be introduced to prevent it being used as a rat-run. A footway will be constructed on one side of the road and a shared footway/cycleway on the other. It is expected to be completed in June 2021 and is subject to a Housing Infrastructure Fund grant of up to £18.972m.

The need for a new link road across the A419 from the NEV to the existing community has also been identified. For this, the Great Stall Bridge will be constructed, but not until after 2021.

The Council is also assessing the feasibility of constructing an additional pedestrian crossing over the A420, east of the junction

with Old Vicarage Lane at South Marston. The purpose of the crossing would be to provide safe travel routes between the proposed village of Rowborough, to the north of the A420, and the new secondary school campus, to the south of the A420. Two possible locations have been identified and a feasibility study will consider the options.

A new road will also be built under the railway line near Acorn Bridge. This will allow access from the A420 to the proposed village of Rowborough.

A number of junctions to the west of the A419 have also been identified as likely to see an increase in traffic as a result of the NEV. The junction locations identified are Piccadilly roundabout and the Nythe Road/Oxford junction. Improvements to these junctions will also add greater vehicle capacity and will start in March 2020. They should take 12 months to complete.

Together the highways schemes at the White Hart roundabout, Southern Connector Road, Gablecross junction, Nythe Road junction and Piccadilly roundabout are expected to cost £72.5m and budgetary approval will be sought at the July Cabinet meeting. To support this, a grant of £47.63m from the Government's Local Growth Fund, delivered via the Swindon and Wiltshire Local Enterprise Partnership, is available.

Limitations with this funding has determined that work needs to be completed by 2021, which means some of the schemes will run simultaneously.

The remaining infrastructure improvements, such as the construction of new schools, health facilities and green spaces, will be addressed as part of the planning development process.

Councillor Gary Sumner, Swindon Borough Council's Cabinet Member for Strategic Planning, said: "I am delighted to see that these important and necessary road improvement works will be brought before Cabinet next week. The New Eastern Villages is a huge development and these highways schemes are the largest we have ever undertaken.

"We are confident that, when finished, these roadworks will make things much better for motorists by reducing journey times and easing congestion.

"We have already been working closely with the residents and businesses who will be most affected while the roadworks are taking place and we will continue to ensure they, along with everybody else in Swindon, are kept up to date with everything they need to know as the works progress.

"It's important that we deliver these road improvements before work starts on building the houses as it will ensure that vital infrastructure is in place first.

"Delivering the NEV is one of this Council's key Pledges and I am pleased to say that work is progressing well and that we are giving priority to these vital infrastructure improvements which will benefit everybody in Swindon."

Recent roadworks at the Greenbridge roundabout and Coate Water roundabout were part of the NEV infrastructure improvements.

Please do not hesitate to contact either the Clerk, the Chair or any member of the council - the numbers appear on the next page. We do hope you will be very happy here.

### Obscured Road Signs, your help is requested

Keeping our village roads safe is a priority for all of us. Ensuring road signs are visible and clear of vegetation is an important contribution to this effort. If you have a road sign on your property or even one near you, please could you ensure that it is clearly visible and not obscured by vegetation. THANK YOU for your efforts.

### Reporting Problems to Swindon Borough Council

For the last several years the Parish Council has advocated the use of a third party website [www.fixmystreet.com](http://www.fixmystreet.com) to report and track issues such as fly-tipping or pot-holes to SBC. There is now a service on SBC's website at [www.swindon.gov.uk/my\\_account](http://www.swindon.gov.uk/my_account) where residents can report these issues directly. Recent experience has shown there is a faster response to those issues reported directly.

### Parish Documents

The Parish has an archive room in the village hall in Bishopstone. This is not accessible to members of the public, however, with advanced warning any document stored there may be viewed by contacting a member of the council. Documents of particular importance are also stored on the parish website and may be viewed by anyone with a PC. Members of the parish without a PC can ask the clerk to provide them with a hard copy.

Documents on the website include the precept, the accounts, standing orders, annual Returns, etc.

### Parish Parking

The Parish has many narrow lanes and these need to be accessible to residents, utility and emergency vehicles at all times. Cars are now being parked along some of the narrowest sections of road (e.g. Cues Lane in Bishopstone, High Street, Bishopstone, etc.) often blocking these routes to even small vehicles. Please remember that emergency vehicles need to be able to move freely down all the roads and lanes of the parish at all times. Could we therefore ask that owners of vehicles park them responsibly and avoid the narrowest sections.

The Village Hall car park in Bishopstone is a private space available only for those using the village hall. It is not somewhere for parishioners to park on a long term basis; whatever the circumstances might be. This is clearly signed on the wall of the hall.

Cars parked here make it very difficult for legitimate car park users to find space for their vehicles. It is also incredibly inconvenient for those users having to load and unload items, or for the infirm or disabled who wish to make use of the hall. Provided the hall is not in use, loading and unloading of vehicles is permitted, as is visitor parking for short periods. By prior arrangement with the committee the siting of skips can also be accommodated.

The committee very much regret that it cannot offer parking for those in need, however, hall users must come first and from the complaints received these are frequently finding it difficult to park.

The Village Hall Management Committee asks that residents remember that *'Skips should not be positioned in close proximity to the Hall structure'*.

### Trees in conservation areas

The whole of Bishopstone and most of Hinton Parva lies within a Conservation Area and as such the legislation is similar to that relating to a Tree Preservation Order, including the financial penalties and tree replacement. If you want to carry out works to a tree you will need to submit a 'notice of intent' to Swindon Borough Council. If you have not heard back from them by the time the six weeks has expired then you may proceed with the works described in your letter. You can complete the Swindon Borough Council Notification for Works on Protected Trees in a Conservation Area form online: [https://www.swindon.gov.uk/forms/form/252/en/applicationnotification\\_for\\_works\\_on\\_protected\\_trees](https://www.swindon.gov.uk/forms/form/252/en/applicationnotification_for_works_on_protected_trees)

You are not required to submit a notice for the cutting down, topping or lopping or uprooting of a tree whose diameter does not exceed 75 millimetres; or the cutting down or uprooting of a tree, whose diameter does not exceed 100 millimetres, for the sole purpose of improving the growth of other trees (eg thinning as part of forestry operations). In either case, the diameter of the tree is to be measured over the bark of the tree at 1.5 metres above ground level. These exemptions do not apply in circumstances where a tree has more than one stem at a point 1.5 metres above the natural ground level if any stem when measured over its bark at that point exceeds the relevant minimum.

And remember—anyone who cuts down, uproots, tops, lops, wilfully destroys or wilfully damages a tree in a conservation area or causes or permits such work, without giving notice is guilty of an offence, unless one of the exceptions above applies.

## PLANNING

### Pre-Application Advice

The Parish Council encourages prospective applicants for planning permission to seek pre-application advice from Swindon Borough Council. Not only does this assist the Parish Council when commenting on applications but going through this process has many benefits for the applicant:-

- It can help applicants understand how relevant planning policies and guidance will be applied to their proposal.
- It can improve the quality of planning application submissions by identifying areas that need to be addressed at an early stage you where you might need specialist advice, such as ecology or high-ways, before you submit.
- It can help applications be registered more speedily and can improve the likelihood of a successful outcome.
- It can save you time and money by identifying if a proposal is unacceptable in principle at an early stage.
