WARNING OVER ONLINE FRAUD

Cyber criminals are taking advantage of the Covid-19 pandemic via phishing emails, websites and text messages to scam members of the public out of large sums of money and sensitive information.

Since the virus took a hold in the UK there have been more than 100 victims of Coronavirus related fraud, with losses of almost £1m recorded.

Wiltshire Police Detective Inspector, Gemma Vinton, said "Criminals are using the Coronavirus pandemic to their advantage and we have seen examples of them adapting their methods to play upon people's fear and anxiety. We are warning everyone to be vigilant, not just the vulnerable or elderly."

When online:

Stop. It's important to stop and think a moment before parting with any money or information.

Challenge. Challenge the origin of your email, text or website. Could it be fake? Check with the sender using another method of communication.

Protect. Protect yourself with added security measures where possible and report anything suspicious to your bank or Action Fraud.

Criminals are sending emails offering fake medical support or supplies, tricking people who may be vulnerable, frightened or increasingly isolated at home. These fraudsters try to lure people in with offers that look too good to be true or make appeals to support bogus charities.

Reports from the public have included online shopping scams where people have ordered protective face masks, hand sanitiser and other items via auction sites, which have never arrived.

There have also been a number of cases where fake testing kits have been offered for sale.

Criminals are sometimes using Government branding to try to scam people, including false offers of financial support through unsolicited emails, phone calls and text messages.

Remember that neither your bank nor the police will ever ask you to transfer money to any so-called "safe" account."

FLY TIPPING, GARDEN WASTE AND BONFIRES

In recent weeks, an increasing amount of garden waste has been dumped in public places. Depositing waste on public land is fly-tipping, which of course is illegal, as well as anti-social. Please retain your garden waste until such time as it is collected, or compost it within the curtilage of your own property.

It is also not permissible to burn your waste.

Following a great many complaints, Swindon Borough Council ask people not to have a bonfire during this time of crisis.

Bonfires can:

- Release toxic smoke when some items are burnt
- Upset neighbours who want to open windows, dry their washing and enjoy their gardens
- Quickly get out of control and put additional pressures on emergency respondents

Burning household waste, DIY waste, plastic, treated wood and other items is always an offence.
